SPRING TOTS CLUB

ART ATTACK SATURDAYS: MIXED MEDIA

Stimulate your imagination and creativity while exploring a range of art making techniques from 2D painting, drawing and printmaking to 3D sculpting and constructing. Participants take inspiration from the Gallery's changing exhibition program, the site and selected contemporary artworks. Students gain confidence in creating across a variety of mediums and techniques. | Ages 5 - 9 | \$180 per child (includes all art materials)



ART ATTACK SATURDAYS: LEGOMATION FIXATION

Unleash your inner Lego geek designing and creating your fantasy set then learn the tricks of stop-motion animation. During the term, participants experiment with speed, perspective and sound as they apply their new found skills using our Gallery iPads. WEDNESDAY DRAWING SCHOOL

Have fun developing your observational drawing skills while exploring a variety of drawing media, including graphite, charcoal and oil pastel. Workshop participants learn an array of skills and techniques while developing their creative confidence. Workshops are inspired by a series of selected artworks from the Gallery's changing exhibition program and Heritage Garden. | Ages 8 – 12 | \$180 per child (includes all art materials)

Gifting is an exhibition of works from Penrith Regional Gallery and other collections which acknowledges and commemorates the significance of gift giving to regional galleries. The exhibition is drawn from the Gallery's collection beginning with the Lewers family gift of the property, buildings, garden and key artworks.
